## The Future of East Asia's and Japan's Security

Yuichi Hosoya, Ph.D., is professor of international politics at Keio University, Tokyo. Professor Hosoya is a member of the advisory board at Japan's National Security Council (NSC). He was a member of Prime Minister's Advisory Panel on Reconstruction of the Legal Basis for Security (2013-14). Professor Hosoya studied international politics at Rikkyo (BA), Birmingham (MIS), and Keio (Ph.D). His research interests include the postwar international history, British diplomatic history, Japanese foreign policy, and contemporary East Asian international security. His recent publications in English include "Japanese National Identity in Postwar Diplomacy," in Gilbert Rozman (ed.), East Asia National Identities: Common Roots and Chinese Exceptionalism (Stanford: Stanford University Press, 2012).

In the lecture, Professor Hosoya will analyze the current and rising challenges to East Asian stability, such as the increasing threat of North Korea's nuclear weapon capabilities, tensions over maritime orders in East and South China Seas, and possible "power shift" with the rise of China, and discuss Japan's security policy under these challenges and U.S. rebalance to Asia. Then he argues how a sustainable and stable security environment should be established in East Asia.
